## Online Safety Tip - Focus on LIVE STREAMING

### What is live streaming?

Live streaming is the broadcasting of real-time, live video to an audience over the internet. All you need to be able to live stream is an internet enabled device, like a smart phone or tablet, and a platform to broadcast on. You can liken it to an 'on the scene' news broadcaster or shows like Big Brother, where the phrase 'You are live, please do not swear!' was made popular.

**Why are live streaming platforms so popular?** Live streaming is highly appealing to children and young people as it presents the chance for them to be a creator, a presenter and to be seen by an audience. You can broadcast anything you are doing across the world without delay or edit. With the popularity of live streaming platforms, such as YouNow and Live.ly, continuing to rise, other more conventional social media platforms have branched out into the world of live streaming with Facebook introducing Facebook Live and Twitter launching Periscope, to name a few.
