Snapchat warning



The NSPCC is warning children not to broadcast their location on Snapchat amid concerns it could leave users vulnerable to grooming, stalking and bullying. Last month the photo-sharing app released its new 'Snap Maps' feature, which enables users to share their location with everyone on their Snapchat contacts list. The feature works to such a precise degree that is possible to tell what part of a building a user is in. The map also displays if the user is travelling in a car or listening to music.

The charity is urging young people to hide their location using the 'ghost mode' setting, and has issued advice to parents. Please see NSPCC.org.uk for more information.
