

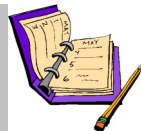

Staying safe during darker nights

We were very lucky to have an assembly led by Nicki Yates, our local PCSO, just before half term. Her theme was 'Staying Safe during darker nights.' She explained to the children the importance of keeping safe during Halloween. She said if they are allowed to go 'Trick or Treating', they should be accompanied by an adult, go in a group and make sure they were visible to road users.

Nicki also told the children about the sign opposite: if this is displayed in windows, they should respect the owners wishes and not knock on their doors. They may be elderly, ill or have young babies who are asleep.

Nicki also discussed bonfire and firework safety. They children listened really well and were very keen to speak to Nicki after the assembly.
