School uniform

Pennyhill School colours are bottle green, white and grey/black.

All uniform must be clearly named

Jewellery

Children may only wear stud earrings and inexpensive watches. Parents must make suitable provision for studs during P.E., such as tape.

School cannot accept responsibility for pupils' private property.

Any parents who want their child to wear items of jewellery or clothing for religious reasons should make an appointment with the Head teacher. Religious bangles should be covered by a sweat band during P.E. sessions.

Hair

There are no "uniform" regulations covering length or style of hair. Hair should, however, be tidy and of reasonable appearance. Pupils should not have extreme hairstyles, patterns, lines or logos shaved into their hair and it should not be of a colour which could be described as unnatural. In some practical lessons, long hair may have to be tied back for reasons of safety or hygiene.

Please note: Any children seen with an extreme hairstyle, a phone call will be made to the parent/guardian asking for it to be changed.

Breaking Uniform Policy.

There may be unforeseen circumstances where children will not be able to wear correct uniform. This needs to be discussed with a member of staff along with a written letter signed by a parent/guardian. If the family is having financial difficulties, the school will be considerate and allow for this by giving parents time to buy the right items however; this will need to be discussed with **Mrs Dudley**.

Please note: Any children wearing trainers without a note will be asked to wear black pumps around school.
