- Our 'Open Door' policy. We are contactable at any time of the day, and the team are available during handover periods at the start and end of the sessions
- Written information in the form of:
 - Our prospectus
 - Application and Registration Forms
 - Parent/Carer Handbook
 - 0-2 and 2-3 'My Day' Books
 - 3-5 'My Week' Book
 - 'Info Point' situated in the Entrance Hall where full copies of our Policies and Procedures, Comments Book and Complaints Procedure can be found , Menus, Routines, Staffing and other fixed information will be displayed
 - 'Hot Spots' Noticeboard, also in the Entrance Hall, for all current information such as topics, activities, events, meetings
 - Newsletters, emails or text messages
 - Our page on the school's website
 - Routine Children's Progress Reports [termly]
 - Children's Progress Check at aged 2
- Visits to our Nursery for:
 - Pre-start experience, for families to meet their key worker and become familiar with the environment
 - Parent's/Carer's Evenings
 - Open Hours/Days
 - Other events
- Providing opportunities for parents/carers to contribute their own skills, knowledge and interests
- Providing information about any relevant services, workshops and training
- Providing regular opportunities for parents/carers to comment on the service
- Being open to providing information in whatever form suits our parents/carers needs e.g. other languages, larger print
